Japan Tsunami

On March 11, 2011, a catastrophic tragedy struck the Northeast coast of Japan – a 33 feet high tsunami triggered by an 8.9 magnitude earthquake slammed the coastal towns. 19,747 confirmed deaths and 2,556 missing.

In addition, the earthquake and tsunami damaged a partial meltdown of the fuel rods in Fukushima's Nuclear Power Plant, which has resulted in the evacuation of all residents living within a 30 km radius of the nuclear power plant.

In the disaster-stricken areas, the people of this prosperous country desperately need food, clean, drinkable water, and supplies. Compassionate Service Society is partnering with Global Medic to help in what we can.

Emergency responders have been using Noah Water Systems since 1999, providing Clean and Safe drinking water to those in need.
